ALABAMA INTERLOCK LAW UPDATE




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
Act 2018-517 Changes

 Length of suspension time prior to being eligible for interlock & duration of interlock:

Conviction #	Suspension	Must serve	Interlock Duration
1 st (election)	90 days	0	90 days
1 st (mandatory)*	90 days	0	1 year; refusal – 2 years**
2 nd	1 year	45 days	2 years; refusal – 3 years**
3 rd	3 years	60 days	3 years; refusal – 4 years**
4 th or previous felony DUI	5 years	1 year	4 years; refusal – 5 years**



^{**}Add one additional year to interlock duration (*See* § 32-5A-191 (t)(2), Ala. Code 1975).



Act 2018-517 Changes

- BAC 0.15 +, child under 14 years in vehicle no longer doubles interlock duration.
 - Changes codified at *Ala. Code* 1975, § 32-5A-191 (i) and (j).
- Pretrial diversion programs require installation of IID for 6 months or duration of program, <u>whichever is</u> greater.
 - Changes codified at Ala. Code 1975, § 32-5A-191 (y)(1)-(4).
- Probation period extended until all IID requirements have been completed.
 - Changes codified at Ala. Code 1975, § 32-5A-191 (z).



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Act 2018-517 Changes

- 10-year lookback (conviction → offense date)
 - Codified at Ala. Code 1975, § 32-5A-191 (p)(1).
- Once a felony, always a felony
 - Codified at *Ala. Code* 1975, § 32-5A-191 (p)(2).
- IID not required if no certified IID provider within a 50-mile radius of residence or employment
 - Changes codified at *Ala. Code* 1975, § 32-5A-191 (aa).
 - Currently 4 approved IID providers:
 - Smart Start
 - Draeger
 - · Sens-O-Lock of America
 - LifeSafer



Act 2018-517 Changes

- Indigency:
 - If declared indigent by the court, defendant is not required to pay any costs associated with installing or maintaining interlock
 - Codified at § 32-5A-191.4(i)(4), Ala. Code 1975.
 - *Separate order required must be declared "indigent for the purpose of interlock. (See § 32-5A-191.4(i)(3), Ala. Code 1975).
 - Indigency determined by court by same criteria as in Ala.
 Code 1975, § 15-12-5(b) & (c)
 - See § 32-5A-191.4(i)(3), Ala. Code (1975).
 - Must pay any fees for any violation and pay for interlock restricted license.
 - See § 32-5A-191.4(i)(4).



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Highlights

First DUI Conviction – no suspension required

- Election (BAC under .15%)
 - Interlock for 90 days
 - Still need order from the court
- Mandatory Interlock for 1 year if:
 - BAC of .15% or more
 - Passenger under 14 in vehicle
 - Injury to someone other than driver
- Refusal Mandatory Interlock for 2 years
 - See § 32-5A-191 (e) and (t)(2)



Highlights

Second DUI Conviction – 45 days suspension required

- Interlock required for two (2) years
 - Refusal 3 years

*Note: revocations require proof of SR-22 insurance upon reinstatement



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Highlights

Third DUI Conviction – 60 days suspension required

- Interlock required for three (3) years
 - Refusal 4 years

*Note: revocations require proof of SR-22 insurance upon reinstatement



Highlights

Fourth DUI Conviction or Previous Felony DUI: one-year suspension required

- Interlock required for four (4) years
 - Refusal 5 years

*Note: revocations require proof of SR-22 insurance upon reinstatement





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A few notes...

- ALEA must receive a court order (or agreement with prosecutor) to issue an interlock restricted license
 - If it comes from an attorney, it must be certified.
 - See AOC E-Forms (Traffic): ALEA-SN
- ALEA must receive a clearance to remove the interlock restriction
 - See AOC E-Forms (Traffic): ALEA-CSN
 - CRO certificate
- A driver must clear all other suspensions before eligible for interlock license
- Changes to implied consent
 - Refusal of <u>any test</u> results in administrative suspension (*changed from just breath test in 2021)
 - 10-year lookback period for alcohol-related contacts (*changed from 5-year lookback in 2021)

NOTIFICATION OF THE CANCELLATION OF YOUR DRIVER LICENSE and/or DRIVING PRIVILEGE

REASON: MUST ADD INTERLOCK DEVICE RESTRICTION TO YOUR DRIVER LICENSE

EFFECTIVE DATE OF CANCELLATION: 03/25/2015

DURATION: Until Cleared

The Alabama Law Enforcement Agency has received a court order requiring you to have an interlock device installed on your vehicle and have an interlock restriction added to your driver license. You are prohibited from operating any type vehicle until you have an interlock device installed and operating on your vehicle sordered by the courted.

An Interlock Device is currently not required until AFTER your suspension/revocation period has been completed. In order to comply with these requirements upon completion of suspension / revocation you must pay a fee of \$150 at any Reinsstement Office and provide proof of installation of an interlock device by an approved provider. This fee is in addition to any other required reinstatement fees. You will then be required to obtain a new license with the interlock restriction at any driver license examining office.

If you have a legal or lawful reason why this cancellation should not be placed into effect you may write this office stating the legal or lawful reason and a hearing may be considered upon review.

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Eligible Applicants

- ADOC Work Release Program
- Community Corrections Program
- ADOC Custody Releases:
 - End of Sentence
 - Parole
 - "Dunks"
 - Mandatory Releases



2018 Additions:


- Any person with a suspended or revoked Alabama driver license AND
- who can demonstrate to the reasonable satisfaction of ALEA they do not pose a risk to public safety AND
- Who cannot obtain reasonable transportation.





Not Eligible:

- DUI Adjudications or Convictions
- Serious Moving Violations involving/resulting in serious physical injury/death
- Serious Traffic Offenses (Title 32)
- Less than 16 years of age
- Medically ineligible for Class D
- Commercial Driving Privileges
- ALEA Secretary or designee retains discretion to not issue a hardship driver license.



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Limited Use

- ▶ Employment
- ▶ Job training, readiness programming, interviews
- ▶ Religious services/functions
- ► Civic events recognized for full societal participation
- ▶ Educational institution or childcare facility
- ▶ Court-ordered program, treatment, community service
- Court appearances
- ▶ Reporting to a probation and parole office
- ► Community Corrections Program
- ▶ Work release program
- ▶ Medical or mental health scheduled treatment or emergency
- ▶ Pharmacy for obtaining prescriptions
- > Purchasing food and household necessities
- ▶ Performing essential household duties
- ▶ Voting, if eligible





Application Process

- Application Form
 - Alea.gov → departments and units → driver license → driver license forms → hardship license application (DL-22)*


*New form coming April 2022

- All required/applicable attachments
- Letter from authorized official (as applicable)
- Required driver information
- DL# of the suspended/revoked license
- Proof of applicable insurance
- Cost of production and issuance (\$36.25)

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Validity Period -Four Years

Reapplication permitted ONLY IF applicant demonstrates good cause to the reasonable satisfaction of ALEA, including demonstrable reentry efforts and/or progress towards resolving issues preventing reinstatement.



Revocation

Revocation - immediate revocation as required by law, any serious traffic offense, accumulation of traffic points, or at discretion of ALEA.

Once revoked, a hardship license is not eligible for reinstatement.



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Hardship Driver License - NOT A PERMANENT SOLUTION

- Resolve all issues preventing DL reinstatement asap
- Apply for DL reinstatement as soon as eligible and as far in advance of Hardship Driver License expiration as possible
- ▶ BE AWARE:
 - ▶ Not REAL ID Compliant
 - Only valid in Alabama
