

PROGRAMS RECOGNIZED

DURING THE GRADUATION AND AWARD CEREMONIES:

















The Certified Municipal Official Program consists of a series of continuing education programs, specialized webinars and online training designed for elected municipal officials – mayors and councilmembers – who are receiving formal training in municipal government.

Officials completing 40 credit hours of training are awarded the professional designation of Certified Municipal Official. The Advanced Certified Municipal Official designation is earned by completing an additional 40 credit hours of training. Officials who have received both their CMO and Advanced CMO designations can obtain the Certified Municipal Official Emeritus designation. The CMO Emeritus is awarded to those who complete a minimum of 120 credit hours of continuing CMO education plus 15 points. CMO Emeritus levels II - IV were created for members who receive over 200 credit hours of training, and 20 points. This expanded recognition of achievement celebrates the lifelong dedication to learning displayed by Alabama's municipal officials.

The first session of the Certified Municipal Official Program was held at the Adams Mark Hotel in Mobile on September 22, 1994, with additional locations in Birmingham, Montgomery and Huntsville. Nearly 200 officials enrolled in the program during the first sessions. As of this year, more than 5,300 municipal officials have enrolled and attended municipal government training provided by ALM.

On May 3, 2024, Gov. Kay Ivey signed the Alabama Municipal Official Training Act ("Training Act") into law. The Alabama League of Municipalities (ALM) drafted the legislation, in partnership with sponsors Sen. Jabo Waggoner and Rep. Jim Hill, to support communities by requiring Alabama municipal officials to complete mandatory training. This training will better position local officials to understand core subjects necessary to maintain their operations, abide by state laws and help their communities prosper.



Alabama Communities of Excellence



Alabama Communities of Excellence, better known as ACE, is an organization with the mission of helping Alabama's smaller communities (8,000 – 12,000) to plan, grow and prosper. In 2021, the Alabama Communities of Excellence program joined the Alabama League of Municipalities after successfully supporting and strengthening 43 communities for close to 20 years. ACE provides technical assistance to smaller communities through a comprehensive, three-phase approach. Phase I focuses on Assessment; Phase II focuses on Leadership Development and Strategic Planning; and Phase III focuses on Comprehensive Planning and Implementation of the Strategic Plan developed during Phase II.

Healthy Alabama Communities Award



The Healthy Alabama Communities (HAC) program was developed in 2024 in partnership with the Alabama Department of Public Health, the Alabama Hospital Association and Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Alabama to support communities and community leaders in identifying and implementing policy, system and environmental changes to improve the health of all community members.

Saraland

ALM's Economic Development Academy was launched in 2021 and is specifically designed to educate and engage municipal officials on the essential elements and phases of economic development while highlighting their vital role in economic initiatives and projects within their communities.

Developed in conjunction with the Alabama Community College System (ACCS) and supported by an advisory council of industry leaders, the EDA engages elected officials from select cities and towns with municipal peers and colleagues from their region to prepare their communities for growth. Using a collaborative municipal team approach, participants convene four times throughout the year to complete assignments and develop strategies to enhance economic development in their communities. Ultimately, each municipality selected is required to implement a community program/project and to report on its progress. Academy graduates are recognized during the ALM's annual Municipal Leadership Institute each fall with a certification via ACCS and ALM.

While only municipal officials and municipal employees are eligible to receive CMO credit, business leaders and regional economic developers are welcome to participate in the program. All participants will receive a certificate from the Alabama Community College System upon completion.
