FIVE QUESTIONS TO ASK DURING INCIDENT INVESTIGATION

When you investigate an incident, you will need to address the five Ws.

Where?

- Where did the incident take place?
- Where was the victim?
- Where were the witnesses?
- Where were the other items that were involved in the incident (vehicles, equipment, falling objects, etc.)?

When?

- When did the incident take place (date, shift, time)?
- Is this the first time an incident like this has taken place? If not, when did the other incident(s) take place?

Who?

- Who was involved in the incident?
- Who was injured?
- Who was at the scene prior to the incident?
- Who were the eyewitnesses?
- Who heard the incident?
- Who came upon the scene after the incident?
- Who might have useful information about this incident?

What?

- What happened?
- What are the circumstances surrounding the incident?
- What events led up to the incident?
- What factors appear to have caused this incident?
- What are the facts relating to this incident?
- What are the characteristics of the injuries?

Why?

- Why did this incident happen?
- Why has this incident happened more than once?
- Why did equipment, the environment, management, or employees fail in this incident?
