3. To obtain a video, fill out the enclosed order form. Videos are loaned on a first-come, first-served basis.
4. A maximum of 3 videos may be checked out by the same entity within the same time period.

B. **Rules For Care of Videos**

1. Only responsible and experienced operators should be allowed to operate the DVD Player.

Video and Safety Meeting Recommendations

Learning increases dramatically through effective use of videos and other audiovisuals. Tests have shown that trainees can learn as much as 55% faster, and remember up to 70% more information thru the use of videos as compared with oral instructions alone. The following are pointers on the effective use of videos.

A. **Selection**

Select a video that most closely fits your employees' needs. Always preview a video before you schedule a showing, as a preview is the only way to know that it is right for your purpose. Make notes on any points in the video that you'll want to discuss after the showing.

Consider using discussion, practice demonstrations, or tests, for reinforcing or expanding upon the video message. Ask a local expert, or a knowledgeable employee, to demonstrate what was shown in the video. Avoid a set routine such as "monthly safety movies". Use videos to break the monotony of safety meetings, not to create monotony.

B. **Introducing a Video**

Tests have proven that an effective introduction of a video and a review of it after a showing can double the video's educational value. Prepare your audience by informing them about the video's major purpose and about any points requiring clarification or emphasis. Arouse interest by explaining how the audience will benefit from the message. Make them want to see the video. Point out how the message applies to their jobs or their lives. Ask a few questions to get your viewers to think about the subject. Create a "climate of interest" before the showing.

C. **Showing**

Immediately after you start the video, double check to make certain that the volume and focus are correct. Remain with the group throughout the entire showing as this helps to maintain full interest.

D. **Follow-Up**

Discussion usually reveals what has been overlooked or misunderstood. Clear up all misunderstandings and fill in on what has been overlooked. Discussion may reveal a need for additional education on the subject. Any type of follow-up activity that reinforces or expands upon the video's message or that promotes actual doing after learning is highly valuable.

E. **Make Videos Pay Their Way**

Costly work time is invested in video showings. That's why it is important to prepare carefully for the use of videos and plan follow-up efforts so that you can receive all the education benefits they have to offer. Videos have more ability to arouse and maintain interest, to inspire, to communicate ideas and to tell "how" and "why" than do any other kind of educational media. With advance planning, proper use, and vigorous follow-up, you will get full value from videos....and from any other audiovisuals that you employ.

The following model safety meeting outline may be used to help videos pay their way.

Model Safety Meeting Outline

1. Select appropriate topic. It's best to concentrate on one problem area than to use the shotgun approach and briefly mention numerous topics.
2. Review past accident injury experience. Let employees know why this topic is being covered.
3. Ask how each accident could have been prevented. Try to get employees to participate in the meeting.
4. Inform employees of proper procedures to be followed. Be thorough and encourage questions. (The employee safety coordinator will provide information when possible.)
5. Provide an actual demonstration. Let a foreman or qualified employee go through the procedure.
6. Show a supporting video, slide show, etc., if available. Videos are a great teaching aid when used properly. Employees retain information much easier when the message is combined with a visual image.
7. Close with comments on the importance of following procedures. You should also stress benefits to the employee, the employee's family and the municipality.
8. Ask for any questions or comments from employees.
9. Post proper procedure, poster, etc., on a bulletin board for employees to review at their convenience.

Some topics that are covered are: right attitude, slips, trips, falls, ladder safety, fall protection, back safety, electrical safety, hand and power tools, control of hazardous materials, confined spaces, scaffolds, trenching and shoring, PPE, fire safety and first aid.

Electrical Service

3.009 **Electrical Arc Flash Safety**

Electrical Arc Flash is a short circuit in the air that has the potential to be a very large short circuit through the air. This can cause extremely dangerous conditions. This video explores these conditions and OSHA regulations that are in place to protect you. It will also help you identify whether or not you are at risk.

Run Time: 13 Minutes

3.010 **Understanding and Working Safely With Electricity: The Basics**

We use electricity all the time and often we don't treat it with the respect it deserves. This video will help you to understand how electricity acts, how it can be approached and the hazards it presents. This video will also show you how these hazards can be controlled. This should be the beginning and not the end of your training in electrical safety. Some primary hazards of electricity include: shock, burns, arc-blasts, explosions and fires. Other topics covered in this video are: lightning safety, electrical storms, extension cords, electrical equipment and grounding, overloading circuits, electrical tools, water and electricity, power lines, heating appliances, fuses and circuit breakers.

3.011 **WSI: Lockout Tagout**

A workplace safety investigation (WSI) is done on a lockout tagout fatality.

3.012 **Electrical Safety for Qualified Workers Refresher**

Electricity is a powerful force that can cause serious injury and death. When it comes to electrical job tasks, it only takes an instant to turn a momentary mistake into a fatality. That's the purpose of this program—to explain the safety precautions these employees must always take to avoid needless tragedies while performing any type of electrical work. Topics include the definition of a qualified worker, approach boundaries, the shock hazard of electricity, voltage-rated gloves and PPE, the arc flash boundary, PPE Levels of arc flash protection, creating and verifying an electrically safe work condition and exceptions when energized work is allowed.

Fire Service / Emergency

4.014 Disaster Safety: Aftermath and Cleanup

No matter what type of disaster you are responding to, this video will provide you with a good understanding of the various conditions and situations you may face. You will learn about assessing hazards, safely handling and clearing debris, dealing with animals, handling human remains, personal protective equipment, handling stress and protection from hazards such as lead, asbestos and other chemicals.

4.015 Back Safety for First Responders

While your EMTs, firefighters and law enforcement officers take care of others, you have to take care of them. To keep them healthy, lean on these solid safety techniques and exercises to keep their back muscles strong and flexible. Some topics discussed in this video are: 1)Back structure, 2)Repetitive stress illnesses/reverse stretching, 3)Common first responder back injuries, 4)Proper lifting techniques, 5)Training points for handling stretchers, gurneys and fire hoses.

4.016 Occupational Disease Prevention for Firefighters

During the course of their careers, firefighters may be exposed to a number of air contaminants and other environmental factors that can cause cardiovascular disease, cancer and noise-induced hearing loss. This video discusses some of the common exposures firefighters face in the field and in fire stations and what they can do to reduce their risk of contracting occupational diseases. Some topics covered are: medical programs, fitness programs, nutrition programs, PPE and on-scene incident management. This video ends up with a discussion of the problems facing smaller fire departments to acquire the resources needed to implement needed programs, and offers solutions to solve this dilemma.

4.017 Emergency Response Driving

As an emergency responder it's your job to save and protect lives and property. It's critical that you arrive to the scene of an incident quickly and safely. There are risks involved anytime you get behind the wheel of a vehicle, but when you are driving an emergency vehicle with lights and sirens blaring, those risks are multiplied.

Those are three important things you will need when you operate a vehicle or any piece of machinery. This video tells the story of a man who was driving a company vehicle home. He stopped to play pool and hang out with some friends on his way home. He made some poor choices. Learn about how this event changed his life and the consequences he has had to face.

This video also discusses backhoe operator's PPE and the backhoe's capabilities and limitations.

Also covered in this video are the daily inspection, work site inspection, minimum approach distance, fall protection, tip over prevention, collision hazards and electrocution hazards associated with bucket trucks.

Nowhere is personal safety more important than in welding and cutting. This video will help you understand why welding accidents happen and what you can do to protect yourself. Other topics covered in this video are PPE, ventilation, handling and storage of cylinders, equipment inspections and understanding fire and safety requirements for welding and cutting.

5.067 Distracted Driving (Focus on Texting and Driving)

There are three main types of distraction: Visual-taking your eyes off the road, Manual-taking your hands off the wheel, Cognitive-taking your mind off what you're doing. Distracted driving is any non-driving activity a person engages in that has the potential to distract him or her from the primary task of driving and increase the risk of crashing. Some forms of distracted driving are: cell phone use, texting while driving, eating, drinking, talking with passengers, as well as using in-vehicle technologies and portable electronic devices. Texting is the most alarming because it involves all three types of distraction.

Pressurized gases are used in so many ways that people take them for granted – to their detriment. Useful they may be, but they are dangerous if handled improperly. Ease the pressure with this program, which covers details on safe and proper handling.

The vast majority of gases used for industrial uses such as welding and cutting are purchased in cylinders. They must be maintained and labeled correctly. Portable fire extinguishers, when used properly, can minimize personal and property damage if a fire occurs. Knowing when and how to use a fire extinguisher is one key to fire safety.
